# Andrew Woods: AOCPMR Musculoskeletal Ultrasound Conference January 17<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>, Breckenridge, CO [Pages 8-9]

<u>Proposal</u>: Participating in this activity provides a certification exam at the end of the conference which will certify both Andrew and Grant in US so that they will be able to help teach students at LMU. #### Alec Donohue - SAMOPS:

To whom it may concern,

The following is intended to provide insight as to the necessity of obtaining funding to send HPSP Candidates to the Military Medical Specialty Night on November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017. This event is hosted by USUHS in Bethesda, MD in order to provide information regarding the Military Match Process, as well as how to audition at various active duty posts.

Lincoln Memorial University has done a wonderful job of providing knowledge about the match and audition process for those entering NRMP match, however there is an overwhelming lack of information regarding the process for HPSP candidates from all branches. The Student Association of Military Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons is requesting SGA funding to support efforts in assisting 1-3 individuals to attend this conference. Ideally, one Officer from each branch (Army, Air Force, and Navy) would be able to attend this conference. Each branch of service has slight variations to their match and audition process. In order to best obtain the branch specific information, and effectively disseminate it to other officers once back at the school, it is quintessential to send individuals.

The conference itself is free of charge to those attending, however transportation costs and lodging are not covered. The event will begin at 1730 on November 28<sup>th</sup>, and conclude at roughly 2100. The address of the event is 8901 Wisconsin Ave, Bethesda, MD 20889.

After looking at costs of travel, rental car seems to be the preferred modality of travel granted 2 or 3 individuals attend. Utilizing USAA Car Rental Services, the cost of Rental from 1500 Nov.  $27^{th} - 1100$  Nov.  $29^{th}$ , would be 88.78 with unlimited mileage. By utilizing rental car, this mitigates the cost which the IRS would grant for mileage on an individuals car used for work, charity, or other public good (\$0.54 x 491.1 miles x 2(Round Trip) = \$530.39). Gas, however, is still an additional expense in which we are requesting reimbursement. The current rate for gas/mile reimbursed is \$0.42 per mile, the rate approved on the travel expense report this training. This total cost amounts to \$412.52 (\$0.42 x 491.1 miles x 2(Round Trip)). If this number seems too pre-calculated, reimbursement based on gas receipt would be welcomed as well.

As for lodging, only one night will be required (Nov. 27<sup>th</sup>) as we will be driving back to Harrogate following the conference. Per the LOI for the event (see enclosures), American Inn Bethesda, DoubleTree Bethesda, or Hilton Garden Inn Bethesda offer military rates. The rates are as follows for the intended dates respectively: \$126.65, \$124.00, \$187.00. The aforementioned prices are without taxes, or potential associated parking fees. Typical per diem as outlined by DOD regulations stipulate a maximum of \$93 per night. If requesting full amount, this would amount to \$279 for three people. Even the most expensive room at \$187.00 would be over \$100 less to house three individuals in attending this conference. Furthermore, the cost to lodge 2 people does not decrease the overall cost of the stay per night.

Dinner will be included with the conference, so we will not be requesting a full per diem reimbursement. However, due to our arrival one day prior to the conference, it is reasonable to request reimbursement toward meal expense per diem as outlined by current GSA standards. The current proportional rate per person is \$30 covering both lunch and breakfast. This would amount to a cost of \$60-90 depending on if 2 or 3 people attended the conference.

PURPOSE OF PROPOSED TRAVEL: Myself and two colleagues, Neal Fischer and
Richard Kim, are giving an hour long key note presentation titled "Possible Applications of 3D Printing in
Assistive Technology" at the annual Tennessee Association of Assistive Technology Conference, on
November 30, 2017 in Franklin, TN. This presentation directly coincides with our ongoing research
project at LMU-DCOM. We are currently actively working on a project titled "Using 3D Printed Prostheti
Hands to Improve the Quality of Life of Appalachian Children with Hand Deformities." This project has
gained IRB approval, and we have collected preliminary data and are currently working on fabricating 30
printed prostheses for two children who live in Loudon, TN. This presentation will be great exposure for
the project and DCOM as a whole and will allow for meaningful networking with occupational therapists
and special education teachers throughout the Appalachian region. We hope to build exposure for our
unique project and identify more children that may benefit from a custom printed prosthesis. We will
represent LMU-DCOM well, as our project directly embodies DCOM's mission of serving rural
Appalachia. The presentation will also demonstrate how DCOM is using technology to both conduct
research and help our community. I have asked the Pediatrics Club for funding of expenses related to
the presentation. However, they declined because they have already committed to provide funding for
currently used devices. We ask that DCOM SGA help with expenses related to the presentation. Thanks
